The sheet pile wall located in Empire, Louisiana, which is owned and operated by the Plaquemines Parish, Louisiana, Government was severely damaged by wind and flooding when Hurricane Katrina struck the Gulf Coast in August 2005. Subsequently, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) prepared project worksheet 8626 to address the repair of the disaster-related damage on the sheet pile wall. However, the Plaquemines Parish Government disagreed with FEMA's determinations and filed a request for arbitration before this Board challenging those determinations. On April 13, 2013, the parties entered into an arbitration agreement in this case that is a final resolution and satisfaction of any and all claims, disputes, demands, rights, and causes of action whatsoever.

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Accordingly, the case is dismissed with prejudice.
