ORDER

On July 10, 2014, the Board received from Akal Security, Inc. a notice of appeal concerning its contract, DJMS-02-D-0001, with the United States Marshals Service, Department of Justice (agency). The contractor provided security services at federal courthouse buildings during the time of and after Hurricane Katrina in 2005. The contractor submitted a claim for payment. The contracting officer denied the claim on the basis that it was submitted outside of the statutory period for a claim--that is, beyond six years after the claim accrued. 41 U.S.C. § 7103(a)(4) (2012). The contractor here appeals the denial.

The parties have resolved the dispute. In accordance with a submission received on September 12, 2014, the Board **DISMISSES WITH PREJUDICE** the appeal.
