Charlene Sedar is or was employed by the United States Marshals Service outside the continental United States. In November 2010, she received a memorandum from the agency retroactively reducing the rate at which she had accrued home leave since September 2009. In February 2016 and again on June 14, 2016, Ms. Sedar's union representative asked the Board to review her claim for the prior accrual rate. This Board does not settle claims concerning leave. The Director of the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) does. 31 U.S.C. § 3702(a)(2) (2012); *Jerald Lucas*, CBCA 5296-RELO (June 27, 2016). On June 21, 2016, the Board afforded Ms. Lucas and the Marshals Service eight calendar days to object to transferring this claim to OPM. As no objection was filed, the claim is transferred to OPM.
