Proceedings in this case were suspended to allow the agency to determine if claimant was eligible for reimbursement for real estate expenses incurred as the result of a permanent change of station. On June 26, 2017, the agency advised:

The Agency (Department of the Army) has reviewed Mr. Jeffrey D. Maday's claim and has concluded that he is eligible to be reimbursed for authorized real estate expenses in conjunction with his permanent change of station to the National Capital Region. Accordingly, within the next 30 days Mr. Maday's travel orders will be amended to authorize real estate expenses. The additional delay in amending Mr. Maday's travel orders is due to a pending decision on the proper source of funding (i.e., FY15 or FY17 funds), by agency fiscal law attorneys.

Upon receipt of the amended orders, Mr. Maday may submit DD Form 1705, Reimbursement for Real Estate Sale and/or Purchase Closing Cost Expenses, along with supporting documentation. Mr. Maday should submit his claim to his supervisor . . . who will forward the claim to other agency officials for final review and approval. In the event Mr. Maday is dissatisfied with the Agency's adjudication of his claim, he may again contact the U.S. Civilian Board of Contract Appeals.

Based on the corrective action outlined above, the Agency respectfully requests that Mr. Maday's claim be dismissed, without prejudice.

On June 26, 2017, claimant informed the Board that he accepts the agency's decision and agrees to the terms set forth therein.

Accordingly, this case is dismissed. In the event claimant is dissatisfied with the agency's subsequent adjudication of his claim, he may request this Board to review the agency's decision.
