ORDER

Buildco Construction Corporation (Buildco) claimed that it was entitled to \$3,228,283 as an equitable adjustment to the price of a contract with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) for the construction of an outpatient addition to the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Brooklyn, New York. The VA contracting officer did not issue a decision on the claim, and Buildco appealed to the Board from the deemed denial of the claim.

The parties have now settled the case and asked the Board to dismiss it with prejudice.

Accordingly, the case is **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE**.
