BEARDSLEY, Board Judge.

Respondent, the General Services Administration, offset a total amount of \$370,468.15 from its lease payments to appellant, 1000-1100 Wilson Owner, LLC, to recoup real estate taxes GSA alleged it had wrongly paid. Appellant has moved for summary judgment in the amount of the offset claiming that the government's right to offset is barred by the Contract Dispute Act's (CDA) six-year statute of limitations, 41 U.S.C. § 7103(a)(4)(A) (2018). Appellant also moved for an award of interest in the amount of \$9559.48 from the date of the offset until November 14, 2018, the date appellant submitted its CDA claim.

GSA does not oppose this motion, except to challenge appellant's claim for \$9559.48 in other than CDA interest.¹ GSA states that it cannot produce any documentary evidence that a contracting officer asserted a claim to withhold the funds and resolve the issues of tax liability and of damages within the CDA limitations period. Based on the Board's decision in *1000-1100 Wilson Owner, LLC v. General Services Administration*, CBCA 6506, 20-1 BCA ¶ 37,642, which involved almost identical facts to this case, GSA's claim for \$370,468.15 is, therefore, barred by the CDA statute of limitations.

Decision

The Board **GRANTS IN PART** appellant's motion for summary judgment and enters judgment for appellant in the amount of \$370,468.15, plus CDA interest to run from November 14, 2018. Only appellant's claim for other than CDA interest remains to be decided in this appeal.
